UNDERSTANDING ISOTOPES

ISOTOPES ARE VARIANTS OF A PARTICULAR CHEMICAL ELEMENT THAT HAVE THE SAME NUMBER OF PROTONS BUT DIFFERENT NUMBERS OF NEUTRONS. THIS RESULTS IN DIFFERENT ATOMIC MASSES FOR THE ISOTOPES OF THE SAME ELEMENT. FOR EXAMPLE, CARBON HAS SEVERAL ISOTOPES, INCLUDING CARBON-12 AND CARBON-14, WITH THE LATTER BEING USED IN RADIOCARBON DATING. UNDERSTANDING ISOTOPES IS FUNDAMENTAL IN FIELDS SUCH AS CHEMISTRY, PHYSICS, AND ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE.

TYPES OF ISOTOPES

ISOTOPES CAN BE CATEGORIZED INTO TWO MAIN TYPES: STABLE ISOTOPES AND RADIOACTIVE ISOTOPES. IMPORTANCE OF ISOTOPE CALCULATIONS

KEY CONCEPTS IN ISOTOPE CALCULATIONS

TO SUCCESSFULLY PERFORM ISOTOPE CALCULATIONS, IT IS ESSENTIAL TO GRASP SEVERAL KEY CONCEPTS, INCLUDING ATOMIC MASS, ISOTOPIC ABUNDANCE, AND DECAY EQUATIONS.

ATOMIC MASS AND ISOTOPIC ABUNDANCE

DECAY EQUATIONS AND HALF-LIFE

THE DECAY OF RADIOACTIVE ISOTOPES FOLLOWS A PREDICTABLE PATTERN DESCRIBED BY THE HALF-LIFE. THE HALF-LIFE IS THE TIME REQUIRED FOR HALF OF THE RADIOACTIVE ATOMS IN A SAMPLE TO DECAY. THE DECAY EQUATION CAN BE EXPRESSED AS:

$$N(t) = N_0 \left(\frac{1}{2} \right)^{(t/T)}$$

WHERE:

- $N(t)$ = REMAINING QUANTITY OF THE ISOTOPE AT TIME t
- N_0 = INITIAL QUANTITY OF THE ISOTOPE
- T = HALF-LIFE OF THE ISOTOPE
- t = ELAPSED TIME

PRACTICE PROBLEMS AND SOLUTIONS

SAMPLE PROBLEM 1

CALCULATE THE AVERAGE ATOMIC MASS OF CHLORINE, GIVEN THAT 75% OF CHLORINE IN NATURE IS CHLORINE-35 AND 25% IS CHLORINE-37.

SOLUTION:

THE AVERAGE ATOMIC MASS CAN BE CALCULATED AS FOLLOWS:

$$\text{AVERAGE ATOMIC MASS} = (0.75 \times 35) + (0.25 \times 37) = 26.25 + 9.25 = 35.5 \text{ AMU}$$

SAMPLE PROBLEM 2

IF A SAMPLE OF A RADIOACTIVE ISOTOPE HAS A HALF-LIFE OF 5 YEARS, HOW MUCH OF A 100G SAMPLE WILL REMAIN AFTER 15 YEARS?

SOLUTION:

AFTER 15 YEARS, WHICH IS THREE HALF-LIVES ($15/5 = 3$), THE REMAINING QUANTITY IS:

$$N(t) = 100\text{g} \left(\frac{1}{2}\right)^3 = 100\text{g} \times 0.125 = 12.5\text{g}$$
