INTRODUCTION TO PUNNETT SQUARES

HOW TO CONSTRUCT A PUNNETT SQUARE

CONSTRUCTING A PUNNETT SQUARE REQUIRES A SYSTEMATIC APPROACH TO ORGANIZING PARENTAL ALLELES AND PREDICTING OFFSPRING GENOTYPES. THE PROCESS TYPICALLY INVOLVES THE FOLLOWING STEPS:

STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE

1. **IDENTIFY THE PARENTAL GENOTYPES:** DETERMINE THE GENOTYPES OF THE TWO PARENTS INVOLVED IN THE CROSS.

TYPES OF INHERITANCE PATTERNS

AUTOSOMAL DOMINANT AND RECESSIVE INHERITANCE

IN AUTOSOMAL DOMINANT INHERITANCE, ONLY ONE COPY OF A DOMINANT ALLELE IS NEEDED FOR THE TRAIT TO BE EXPRESSED. CONVERSELY, FOR AN AUTOSOMAL RECESSIVE TRAIT TO BE EXPRESSED, AN INDIVIDUAL MUST INHERIT TWO COPIES OF THE RECESSIVE ALLELE.

SEX-LINKED INHERITANCE

SEX-LINKED TRAITS ARE ASSOCIATED WITH GENES LOCATED ON THE SEX CHROMOSOMES (X OR Y). THESE TRAITS OFTEN DISPLAY DIFFERENT INHERITANCE PATTERNS IN MALES AND FEMALES DUE TO THE PRESENCE OF ONE X AND ONE Y CHROMOSOME IN MALES, WHILE FEMALES HAVE TWO X CHROMOSOMES.

INCOMPLETE DOMINANCE AND CODOMINANCE

IN INCOMPLETE DOMINANCE, NEITHER ALLELE IS COMPLETELY DOMINANT, RESULTING IN A BLENDED PHENOTYPE IN HETEROZYGOUS INDIVIDUALS. CODOMINANCE, ON THE OTHER HAND, OCCURS WHEN BOTH ALLELES IN A HETEROZYGOUS INDIVIDUAL ARE FULLY EXPRESSED, LEADING TO A PHENOTYPE THAT DISPLAYS BOTH TRAITS DISTINCTLY.

EXAMPLES OF PUNNETT SQUARES

TO SOLIDIFY YOUR UNDERSTANDING OF PUNNETT SQUARES, LET'S EXPLORE A FEW PRACTICAL EXAMPLES. THESE EXAMPLES WILL ILLUSTRATE HOW TO PREDICT GENOTYPES AND PHENOTYPES USING THE PUNNETT SQUARE METHOD.

EXAMPLE 1: MONOHYBRID CROSS

CONSIDER A MONOHYBRID CROSS BETWEEN A HOMOZYGOUS TALL PLANT (TT) AND A HOMOZYGOUS SHORT PLANT (tt). THE PUNNETT SQUARE WOULD LOOK LIKE THIS:

- PARENTAL GENOTYPES: TT x tt
- OFFSPRING GENOTYPES: ALL Tt (TALL)
- PHENOTYPIC RATIO: 100% TALL PLANTS

EXAMPLE 2: DIHYBRID CROSS

NOW, LET'S EXAMINE A DIHYBRID CROSS BETWEEN TWO HETEROZYGOUS PARENTS (AaBb x AaBb) FOR TWO TRAITS. THE RESULTING PUNNETT SQUARE IS MORE COMPLEX:

- PARENTAL GENOTYPES: AaBb x AaBb
- OFFSPRING GENOTYPES: 9 A_B_, 3 A_bb, 3 aaB_, 1 aabb
- PHENOTYPIC RATIO: 9:3:3:1
